Founded in 1927, the Henry Art Gallery (the Henry) is a Seattle institution and a key cultural resource for all of the Pacific Northwest. The Henry is the State of Washington's oldest art museum, and it is the only museum in our region dedicated to contemporary art. The Henry's collections – including over 28,000 works spanning painting, photography, works on paper, ceramics, sculpture, installation pieces, time-based media and costume and textiles – are foundational to the institution's work.

Through the Henry's Reed Collections Study Center, the Henry provides free and direct access to collection objects to support academic and artistic research as well as public curiosity. The Henry also makes its collection accessible to the public through a number of popular free programs, many of which have transitioned online in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. These unique programs ensure public access to the arts and demonstrated commendable dedication to the community as they move online to continue public access to the collections while respecting Governor Inslee's Stay Home, Stay Healthy order.

In the Henry's proposed project, the gallery would install compact racks, reorganize and rehouse hundreds of objects from the collection and perform new photography and study of its collections. This project would guarantee the continued outstanding standard of care for the art and would make the works easier for staff to access and preserve. It would also enhance the availability of and safe public access to the Henry's collections for generations to come.
