Founded in 1927, the Henry Art Gallery is a Seattle institution and a key cultural resource for all of the Pacific Northwest. The Henry is the State of Washington's first art museum, and it is the only museum in our region dedicated to contemporary art. The Henry's collections — including over 28,000 works spanning painting, photography, works on paper, ceramics, sculpture, installation pieces, time-based media and costume and textiles — are foundational to the institution's work.

Through the Henry's Reed Collections Study Center, the Henry provides free and direct access to collection objects to support academic and artistic research as well as public curiosity. The Henry also makes its collection accessible to the public through a number of popular free programs, both in-person and online. These unique programs ensure public access to the arts and demonstrate commendable dedication to community equity as a free, public resource.

In the Henry's proposed project, the museum will install compact racks; reorganize and rehouse hundreds of objects from the collection for more efficient storage and ease of access; ensure the preservation and safety of the art from seismic events; and update their online inventory and catalogue of resources for public research and study.

This project will guarantee the continued outstanding standard of care for the art and will make the works easier for staff to access and preserve. It will also enhance the availability of public access to the Henry's collections for generations to come.

The Henry Art Gallery is one of Pacific Northwest's cultural gems and an outstanding resource for the study of contemporary art. That is why I strongly support the Henry's application for an
