## Dear President Trump:

We write to express our opposition to the Administration's detention of families and children in Texas, and its consideration of plans to hold families on military bases. The last Administration rightfully ended the use of family detention because it is well-documented that detaining children, regardless of the length of detention, causes lasting harm, and yet does nothing to deter migration. We strongly urge you reconsider this cruel action.

The harm of detaining children is clear: According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, "there is no evidence that any amount of time in detention is 'safe' for children. In fact, even short periods of detention can cause psychological trauma and long-term mental health risks for children." In addition, incarceration hinders normal child development, disrupts family roles and dynamics, and undermines a parent's authority and ability to address their children's needs. When children witness their parents being treated poorly by detention staff or sense their helplessness in detention, it undermines a child's sense that their parent is an authority figure who can provide security and protection.

Family detention has proven to be ineffective in deterring migration<sup>6</sup> and is unnecessary given the existence of effective alternatives. Case management programs have an established record of ensuring compliance with immigration obligations while allowing families to remain in communities. For example, the Family Case Management Program (FCMP) used case managers to ensure families comply with immigration obligations without relying on costly and harmful immigration detention. The program produced a 99 percent compliance rate with Immigration and Customs Enforcement and immigration court requirements.<sup>7</sup> Moreover, FCMP cost only \$36 per day per family compared to family detention, which cost \$319 per person per day in 2019.<sup>8</sup> The FCMP demonstrated that when individuals are provided with clear assistance to navigate the immigration system, they follow through on their obligations.

As the Administration has increased detention of undocumented immigrants, it has become clear that the costs and logistics of some of these plans are wasteful and too difficult to implement. Reviving family detention will not make America safer, nor will it generate efficiency within the government, but will instead deprive the administration of detention space it could otherwise use for individuals who pose a public safety threat. Multiple administrations have tried to use family detention, only to find it does nothing to prevent families from seeking safety here and instead serves only to traumatize new generations of children.

We urge you not to reimplement this failed policy of cruelly detaining families and to instead consider proven alternatives to detention when necessary.
